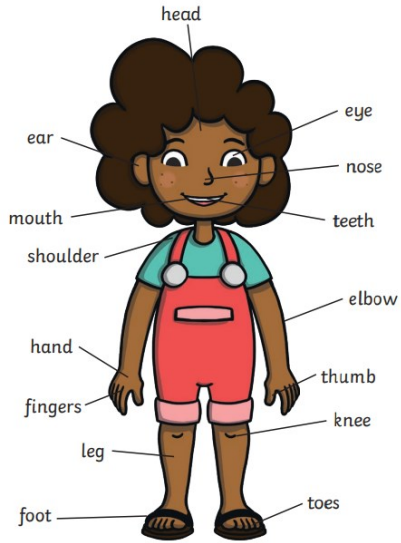

amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin.	sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.
birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.	hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different sounds are.
fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.	touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it!
mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.	taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet. You might have some tastes you like and some you don't.
reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin.	smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.
carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are carnivores.		
herbivore	Animals that only eat plants are herbivores.		
omnivore	Animals that eat both plants and other animals are omnivores.
