Music Curriculum

At St Nicolas, we value Music as an essential part of children's learning experience. Our curriculum enables them to express themselves creatively while also extending their knowledge of the fundamental aspects and rich history of the subject at the same time.

During their musical learning journey, the children are exposed to a range of opportunities to listen, appraise, compose, perform and evaluate their own work and that of others through high quality planning and teaching.

They are also exposed to a range of opportunities to further their knowledge of the interrelated dimensions of Music in increasing depth as they move through the school.

We utilise the multi-award-winning music teaching and learning support tool Charanga to deliver our music curriculum and each year group has the opportunity to learn a different instrument through whole class teaching.

Co-curricular music

We wish to immerse the children in an extensive and diverse range of musical styles, and provide them with exciting musical experiences to continue to engage, challenge and inspire them. The children have access to a wide range of musical instruments to explore and develop skills across the different elements of the subject.

Each year group has the opportunity to learn a different instrument through whole class teaching. Children are signposted to further opportunities within the local area through our music hub which are regularly advertised through our newsletter and social media.

We currently offer a weekly key stage 2 after school choir, which is open to all pupils and has a nominal fee that is paid for those receiving Pupil Premium funding

Musical experiences

At St Nicolas we aim to promote a love for Music and everything it embodies, in all of our pupils and staff alike.

Each year group has at least three formal opportunities to perform to the school community both within school and at our local church.

There are a variety of performances across the school years including Nativity, Easter and Harvest. This accumulates in an end of year 6 production held at the local Abbey Theatre.

Children also get the chance to be part of the audience for a number of performances including a World Book Day play and outside pantomime.

Our collective worship regularly includes opportunities for singing and it has been noted in our recent SIAMs inspection "Singing together in worship is a unifying experience. Adults treasure singing together with the pupils and being part of something bigger."
